Introduction

At Skegness Academy we offer a wide variety of support for our children who have special educational needs. The department is led by our SENDCO, Mrs Coates-Metheringham, who is supported by the Deputy SENDCO, Miss Robbens, the SEND Manager, Mrs Cussons, and a very specialised team of 28 teaching assistants and learning mentors.

We continuously strive to meet the aim of the local offer and empower our pupils to take every opportunity offered from the Academy and to receive a full and enriched curriculum that meets all their needs.

Support in the Academy

Our SEND children are supported in the classroom both by TA support and quality first

teaching. All pupils on the SEND register have a pupil passport that staff can access so that each child can be supported in their needs and can achieve their very best. We also offer access to our SEND hub, where students can go if they need time to regulate their emotions or are feeling overwhelmed by the classroom. We pride ourselves on our work with parents, and we believe that it is only by working together as a team, that the children will thrive and meet their full potential.



Wider Support

Not only does the team support those who already have identified special needs, but we also help with supporting parents if they feel their child has a special need that has not been diagnosed. We work collaboratively with outside agencies to make sure all SEND childrens' needs are met. We can refer for many things including dyslexia, ADHD, ASD and speech difficulties.







The Local Offer

This is the Council's offer to parents and young children. It includes provisions that are both in and out of the Academy and will include support and services that are provided by private and voluntary sectors, as well as the council and the NHS.
