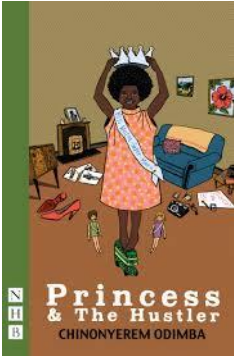


• Week 1

The Windrush Generation

- The Windrush generation refers to Caribbean citizens who **migrated** to the UK between 1948 and 1973, many to help rebuild post-war Britain.
- A scandal emerged when it was discovered that many members of this generation were wrongfully denied their rights and treated as **illegal immigrants** due to a lack of documentation, despite their legal entitlement to reside in the UK.



• Week 2

- Maya Angelou was a black female writer. We read her poem 'Still I Rise'.
- She was always a strong woman. At 16, Angelou decided she wanted to be a cable car conductor, but she was refused an application form. Her mother told her to sit in the office every day until they changed their minds. She did this for two weeks, enduring **mockery** and racist comments. Eventually, this persistence won her the job.

• Week 3

- **Apartheid** was a racist system that treated black people differently to white people. It kept black people separate from white people, in poorer conditions and with less opportunities in life.
- The system ended in 1994, when black people got to vote in a new government. Things changed when Nelson Mandela was elected as president of South Africa – the first black president.

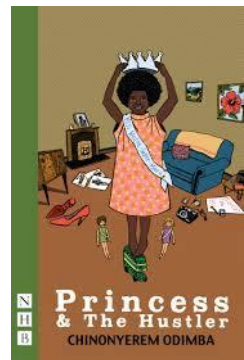
