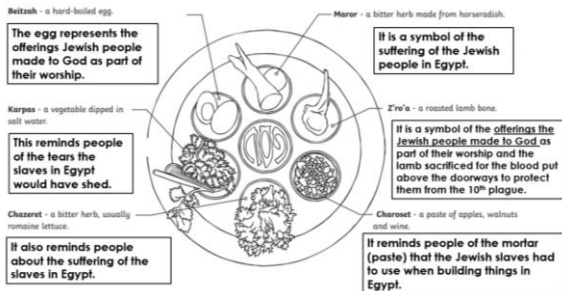


Week 1

Pesach(Passover).

- Important festival in the Jewish year.
- On the evening before the Passover starts, Jews have a service called the Seder. Family and friends gather for a meal.
- They retell the story of Exodus.

Seder Plate

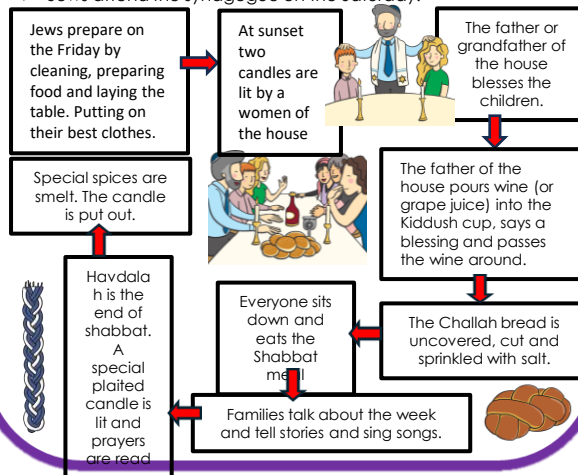


During Pesach (Passover) Jews use food to help them retell the story of the Jews liberation from slavery.

Week 2

Shabbat.

- Saturday is the day of rest in Judaism known as the 'shabbat'
- The fourth commandment- 'You shall remember to keep the Sabbath day Holy.'
- Jews attend the synagogue on the Saturday.



Week 3

The Messianic age-A period of time on earth in which the messiah, a righteous **king** will reign and bring universal **peace** regardless of race and culture.

The messiah will:

- They will unite humanity.
- A great political leader.
- Chosen by God.

Messiah means 'anointed one'

Jewish views on the Messiah

Jews believe that when the Messiah comes, he will do the following:

- Rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem
- Bring about a new messianic age- life of peace
- Bring a true awareness of God to all people
- Signal the end of the world.
- A military leader to fight and defeat the enemy- the Romans.
- Born in Bethlehem.
- Someone descendant of David.

❖ **Jews do not believe that Jesus was the Messiah.**

❖ **Christians believe Jesus is the Messiah, the saviour who has been chosen to bring salvation to humankind.**

The Holy Trinity

- Christians believe in **one** God
 - They believe he exists in **three parts** or **persons**
 - **Father, the Son** and the **Holy Spirit**, known collectively as the **trinity**.
- 'We believe in one God, the father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth... We believe in One Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God...of one Being with the Father... who was made man...he suffered death and...he rose again...we believe in the Holy Spirit...the giver of life, who proceeds and the Father and the Son...who spoken through the prophets' (Nicene Creed)

Week 5

What is the Bible?

- Christian Holy scripture.
- The Bible is a collection of books. 39 books in the Old Testament and 27 books in the New Testament.

How is the Bible used and why is it important?

Sets out God's law e.g. the 10 commandments.

Helps Christians understand God.

Gives an account of Jesus' life. Helping Christians follow in Jesus' footsteps.

Used as a basis for worship.



Helps guide Christians in life.

Helps Christians make decisions in everyday life.

Used during rites of passage and ceremonies

Helps comfort Christians in troubled times.

What is the Pesach?	A Jewish festival where Jews remember the Jews liberation from slavery.
What is the Seder?	A Jewish service where family and friends come together for a meal on the evening before the Passover.
Draw the Seder plate and write down what each of the items on the plate symbolise.	<p>Seder Plate</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Matzah - a hard-boiled egg. The egg represents the offerings Jewish people made to God as part of their worship. Maror - a bitter herb made from horseradish. It is a symbol of the suffering of the Jewish people in Egypt. Karpas - a vegetable dipped in salt water. This reminds people of the tears the slaves in Egypt would have shed. Charoset - a paste of apples, walnuts and dates. It reminds people of the mortar (paste) that the Jewish slaves had to use when building things in Egypt. Zeroa - a roasted lamb shank. It is a symbol of the offering the Jewish people made to God on part of their worship and the lamb sacrificed for the blood put above the doorway to protect them from the 10th plague.

How do Jews start the Shabbat?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➢ Two candles are lit by a women of the house. ➢ The father blesses the children. ➢ Blessing is said and wine or grape juice is drunk. ➢ Challah bread is uncovered, cut and shared out. ➢ Family and friends eat a meal. ➢ Tell stories and sing songs.
How do Jews end Shabbat?	Havdalah is the end of shabbat. A special plaited candle is lit and prayers are read. Special spices are smelt. The candle is put out.
